In Fall, 1966, I went to U Mass in Amherst to major in zoology in preparation for a career in medicine (as planned from third grade). My mother's illness and death during my second and third years there kept me from fulfilling this plan, and, in conjunction with the student power and anti-war movements, contributed to my growing interest in social philosophy. An old friend of the family mentioned that he might be able to help me get settled were I to study Chinese in Taiwan and I chose this over options like further laboratory work at Mass General and Peace Corps or Vista.

After first year Chinese at Stanford in Summer, 1970 (completing my BS) and a few months in Seattle, I studied Mandarin intensively and lived with a Chinese family in Taipei for six months. I was awarded a fellowship by the East West Center while there. This is a fascinating community of students from all over Asia plus the USA at the U of Hawaii.
